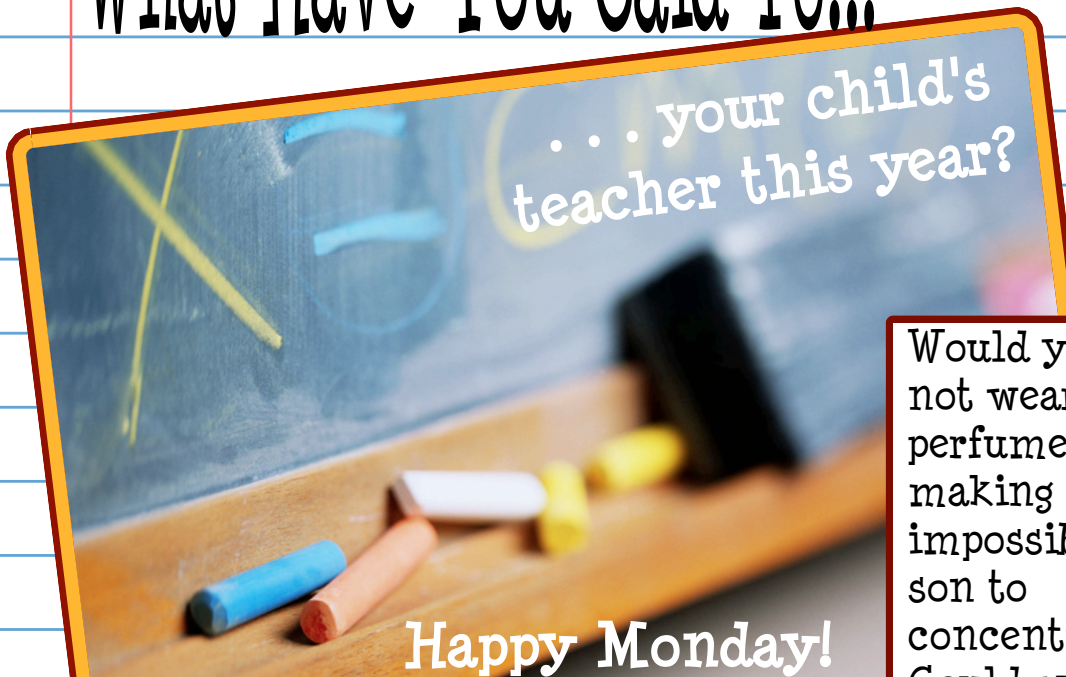


What Have You Said To...



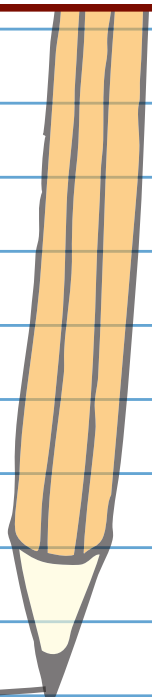

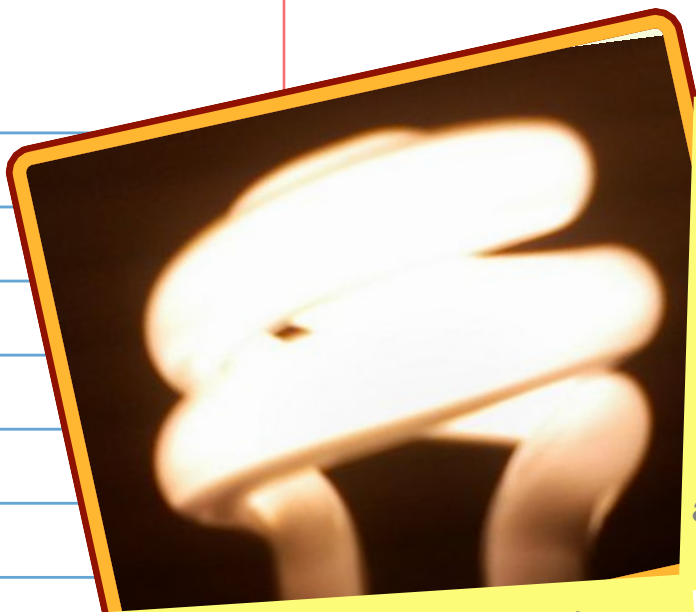
What have you said to your child's teacher this year? Here are our best. Yes, we might be thought of as insane in certain school districts... Its OK, We're OWNING it.
